



Garden bed 20: Gazebo Island Garden bed. This is a small island Garden bed to the south west of the Stan Peck Gazebo. It features a small birdbath facing the lookout across Kareena Creek. The **Stan Peck Gazebo** is a **Significant Shire Landmark**, commemorating a prominent ABC garden personality during the 1960s and 1970s. It is often used for small wedding ceremonies.










The **Stan Peck Gazebo** looks directly onto this Garden bed. The **Bridge Garden** begins at rear of the Gazebo (Garden bed 21).
