




Garden bed 21: Bridge Garden bed. This Garden bed begins to the south of the Main Bridge and follows the western side of Kareena Creek, ending at the Stan Peck Gazebo. A Persian Witch Hazel (*Parrotia persica*) grows just past the bridge; another feature is a large Sweetgum (*Liquidambar styraciflua*).









Bridge Garden bed begins to the south of this bridge on the western side of the creek concluding at the Stan Peck Gazebo. View here is of the bridge from the eastern side.

Up to 30 petals with scattered stamens. Originally a seedling from <i>C. x williamsii</i> 'Donation' backcrossed to <i>C. japonica</i> 'Masayoshi'.</p> <p>1962-63, for 'Charlean', originated by William Stewart, Savannah Georgia, US. Reg.
