


***Garden bed 23: Cascade Garden bed.*** This large Garden bed south of the Duck Pond and slopes down to the eastern back of Kareena Creek. It contains a significant collection of camellia cultivars of which a number are still being researched.

CGN1114	<i>C. japonica</i> 'Contessa Woronzoff'	To be photographed in 2014	Medium formal double to rose form double, strong lavender pink with veining. This cultivar in Australia does not exhibit white edges on petals.  1858, Van Houte Catalogue, Belgium but probably originated in Italy by Bourturlin. However, Australian cultivar may be a sport.	July to September

CGN1129	<i>C. japonica</i> 'Alba Plena'		<p>Large to medium formal double pure white.</p> <p>1797, Andrew's <i>Botanical Repository</i>, brought what was to be named as 'Alba Plena' to the UK in 1792 by the East India ship <i>Carnatic</i> by Captain Connor. Originated in China and of great antiquity.</p>	July to September
CGN1134	<i>C. japonica</i> 'Brushfield's Yellow'	 <p>Photo courtesy Jim Powell, Camellias Australia.</p>	<p>Medium anemone form with antique white guard petals with a centre of tightly ruffled pale primrose petaloids.</p> <p>1970-71, Camellia Grove Nursery Catalogue, originated by Keith Brushfield, Somersby, NSW.</p>	June to August
