*Garden bed 29: RSL Cascade Garden bed*. This Garden bed encompasses the perimeter of the RSL Cascade memorial. There is currently one camellia planted in this Garden bed.

It features a **Significant Landmark**, originally a fountain in memory of the fallen by the Sub-Branches of the Returned Services League (RSL), opened by Sir Roden Cutler on 7 April 1973. The original jet fountain was later replaced with a cascade a decade later, as the water pressure kept clogging the jet with silt.
